Words from Ken

Highlights from the March 2024 Board of Trustees Meeting

The Lake Junaluska Board of Trustees held its biannual meeting on March 7-8, 2024. Following are highlights from the meeting:

The board heard a presentation from HotelDesign Group about a proposed refresh to the Terrace Hotel guest rooms and ground-level entrance. The board of trustees approved a loan of up to \$750,000 for improvements and recommended the staff present plans for a renovation of the Terrace Dining room to the executive committee of the board by July 1, 2024.

Chuck Lipp provided an update on the work completed by the Dam Preservation and Renewal Task Force. He emphasized the importance of maintaining the dam, noting it as the Assembly's biggest financial asset. Chuck highlighted the unique challenges of maintaining and managing a dam and also discussed the current state of the dam, emphasizing the need for continuous improvement, including using ground-penetrating radar on the embankment for a better understanding of the dam's structure.

He also discussed the application for a FEMA grant to fund the repair and improvement of the original dam. The grant, if approved, would require a 35% match, with the remaining \$1.7 million to be funded by FEMA.

The board was also updated regarding sediment removal, hourly employee compensation, and the possibility of developing a senior living facility at Lake Junaluska as outlined in the strategic vision. lakejunaluska.com/vision

Jan Lemasters provided a report from the Volunteer Engagement Task Force. The task force focused on Aspiration 5, Goal 4 of the strategic vision: to identify opportunities where volunteers can participate in the fulfillment of the Lake Junaluska mission and, based on those needs, develop a plan to recruit volunteers and volunteer leaders to increase overall participation in volunteering at Lake Junaluska and to track overall volunteerism annually, recognize and celebrate milestones.

Pat McKim was introduced to the board as the director of program ministries. Pat most recently served as director of discipleship for St. Luke's United Methodist Church in Hickory. Her long history with Lake Junaluska began when she was eight years old and her family moved to Lake Junaluska to be near her grandparents who lived on Littleton Road.

The board announced the formation of a task force to develop a five-10 year strategic plan for the golf course. The task force will present its report to the board at its October meeting.

Actions taken by the Lake Junaluska Board of Trustees during the March meeting:

The board of trustees ratified the actions taken by the executive committee to approve the 2024 operating and Assembly Public Works budgets.

The board of trustees approved the designation of two estate gifts for the preservation of the lake and dam and the preservation of sacred spaces. These gifts totaled \$29,000 and \$29,353.57.

The board of trustees approved the services of Forvis to conduct the 2023 audit.

The board of trustees ratified the actions taken by the executive committee to approve the potential receipt of a grant for recreation area improvements.

Thank you for all you do to help us live into our mission to be a place of Christian hospitality where lives are transformed through renewal of soul, mind and body.
