## Junaluskans General Meeting Harrell Center February 7, 2024

Jan Lemasters called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

Opening prayer was offered by Don Rankin.

**Guest Speaker:** Guest speaker, Chuck Lipp, speaking on behalf of the LJA Dam Preservation Group, gave a report on the Lake Junaluska dam. They are working to develop both a 10-year and a 50-year plan. The current safety rating is less than satisfactory for the dam which was constructed in 1911-1912. Repairs were made in the 1930's, 1950's, 1970's, and to the buttresses in 2004. The current need is to extract a log without damaging the control gate in which it is lodged. The dam is currently stable, but the earthen part of the dam and the area between the buttresses need reinforcing. Current maintenance is projected to be \$100K per year. Within the next 10-15 years expenses will be \$5 - \$15 million. Current funding is \$25K per year, and applications have been sent to the State of NC for \$1.5 million and to the Federal government for \$2 million.

On the brighter side, APW has reduced water loss from 50% down to 10%.

- Drawdown of the lake continues as sediment is being removed. The option of dredging in the future is being investigated.
