The hike begins at Soco Gap (on US 19 toward Cherokee) and follows the Mountains-to-Sea Trail uphill toward Waterrock Knob.

The group will meet on Friday, June 6th at 10:00a at the Bethea Welcome Center. Be sure to bring water, lunch, and a hiking stick if you have one.
