This summer, we will celebrate Lake Junaluska's 112th year. Throughout our rich history, we have created many traditions. From tranquil cruises aboard the Cherokee and youth groups hiking to the cross, to dazzling fireworks over the lake, inspiring Easter sunrise services, and thought-provoking conferences in Stuart Auditorium, these moments have shaped our shared experience.

Also among these cherished traditions is our commitment to dreaming big and working together to turn those dreams into reality. Many of our beloved landmarks, such as the Memorial Chapel, the Rose Walk, the Corneille Bryan Native Garden and, most recently, the Warren Center, have sprung from these collective aspirations.

The same spirit of collaboration also gave rise to another important piece of our history. In 2006, Lake Junaluska resident Wright Spears, a 95-year-old advocate for peace, envisioned a gathering where people from diverse backgrounds could come together to foster dialogue, understanding and reconciliation. From this vision and support from community members, the Peace Conference was born in 2008 with Lake Junaluska serving as the ideal setting for meaningful conversations and bridge-building.

Spears, deeply committed to peaceful collaboration across cultural and ideological divides, believed that open conversation could heal divisions and promote lasting peace. His goal was to create an inclusive conference where participants could share experiences, explore complex global issues and work together to find common ground. Through the Peace Conference, Spears sought to leave a lasting legacy of unity, compassion and collective action toward a more peaceful world.

Now, the dream continues. Thanks to the leadership and dedication of Bishop Ken Carter and other committed organizers, the 11th Peace Conference will be held at Lake Junaluska April 4-6. This year's theme is Breaking Down the Dividing Walls, which recognizes that although people are surrounded by escalating divisions and violence, it is not their differences that divide them, but their hostility toward others.
