## Thank YOU, Junaluskans!

On behalf of the Junaluskans' board and members, our heartfelt thanks to the many volunteers who helped (and continue to help) clean up after Helene. Because not all staff could return immediately following the storm, Junaluskans stepped in to assist wherever needed.

The day after the storm a group of Junaluskans were scraping thick mud off the foot bridge and cleaning up the walking trail. Members cleaned tables and mopped floors daily at the York Dining Commons to make it nice for first responders. Others put up messages of thanks and encouragement at York and prayed with first responders. Melba Hanson prayed over each chair and Linda Carlson comforted responders who came to help with heavy hearts.

At the hotels, Junaluskans assisted in changing bedding, helping clean rooms and hallways and cleaning outdoor balconies chairs and windows. They also helped unload trucks that were bringing food to the hotels. Daily, members bagged lunches for first responders, as many as 400 lunches on some days! Several ladies spread joy while packing lunches or folding laundry by singing hymns!

Todd Stewart lead a team of men who worked for days removing debris from around the lake, recreation areas, the walking path and buildings. They cut up fallen trees. They power washed Weldon gym. Lynette Stewart single-handedly washed the remaining mud off the foot bridge.

Jim Pearson and John Johnson lead teams in removing debris from the lake itself. Junaluskans and county residents who offered to help, worked in kayaks and canoes pulling tires (209 and counting) and other debris from the lake. These teams are still working. This was especially difficult and dangerous work. They are doing a wonderful job!

Teams of Junaluskans and others help clean Clothes to Kids. The store was flooded, so drywall and carpeting had to be removed. Many people washed wet and muddy clothes. Many items, like shoes, were too damaged to be saved.

There were many neighbors helping neighbors throughout Lake Junaluska immediately following the storm. For those without electricity, neighbors shared their generators. Others offered hot showers, a place to cook food and recharge cell phones.

We deeply appreciate all that Junaluskans did to restore Lake Junaluska to the beautiful and peaceful retreat it is. All the volunteers and neighbors lived up to our mission of "being a place of Christian hospitality".

THANKS TO ALL OF YOU WHO HAVE BEEN CONCERNED ABOUT THE DEVASTATION FROM HURRICANE HELENE TO THE **CLOTHES TO KIDS** SHOP IN CLYDE. WE SUSTAINED FOUR FEET OF WATER! THE WEEK AFTER, WE HANDED OUT 100'S OF BAGS OF WET CLOTHES TO BE WASHED AND STORED. THE HELP FROM THE COMMUNITY WAS OVERWHELMING! #### **Most Grateful**

Thank you for your dedication over the past month as we have worked together to restore our beloved community following Hurricane Helene's rampage through this area. Over the past month, we have hosted hundreds of emergency, recovery, and law enforcement workers who have come to our region to assist in this time of need.

Many of the people we hosted have commented on the beauty of the grounds the friendly spirit thev From experienced. the community members who led prayers, to those who prepared meals and helped clean up the grounds, the impact of the Junaluskans is clear in every detail. Below is a quest comment that summarizes the feelings so many have shared:

"The dedication of your staff and volunteers during such a trying time as Hurricane Helene was humbling. While standing outside next to the cross, trying to find a cell phone signal, I looked up and saw the beauty of Lake Junaluska. It was right after Hurricane Helene, and it struck me that even in the midst of chaos, God is present."

Every day, we continue to see progress as we recover from the storm. The demolition and cleaning of the Harrell Center, Stuart Auditorium and York Apartment, all of which had flood

damage, have been completed. We are now receiving estimates for rebuilding and will have further updates on the timing of this work soon. The public restrooms on the upper level of Harrell Center and Gifts and Grounds have reopened.

In mid-November or early December, we plan to lower the lake by approximately five feet to inspect the shoreline along the Rose Walk and develop plans to repair the three landslides. We will also inspect the spillway on the dam at this time and hope that the drawdown will be brief and not disruptive to the beauty of Lake Junaluska.

The Town of Waynesville sewer line that crosses Richland Creek near the golf course was damaged during the storm. Luckily, there was a blockage in the line that diverted the flow from coming into the lake. Thanks to the rapid response of contractors working for the Town of Waynesville, repairs are almost complete, and a catastrophe has been avoided.

Looking ahead, we are welcoming group events and leisure guests back to the grounds, and reservations are coming in for Thanksgiving lodging and our Thanksgiving buffet. Christmas decorations are being prepared, and we look forward to a busy Advent season filled with worship services, community fellowship and holiday festivities.

Thank you for being amazing people and ensuring that each day we live into our mission to be a place of Christian hospitality where lives are transformed through renewal of soul, mind and body.

#### THE SWANS OF FALL

Nesting season, the raising of eight cygnets, and goodbyes have been shared between parents, cygnets, siblings, and volunteers, as six of the cygnets have gone to their new homes. It is only through the grace of God in caring for them and guiding and strengthening us that we were able to raise eight cygnets. Some have asked "why" we have not kept all eight cygnets. Our lake cannot sustain 18 swans, and we do not have the volunteers to care for them. They all went to good homes, so again they and we are blessed.

Questions have been asked multiple times about if and how the swans and cygnets got through the storm. They all survived well, traumatized for sure, but their instincts led them to where they could sustain the winds and endure the heavy rains. It was an anxious night; we were out at first light to check on each one.

As we move deeper into fall and with winter looming ahead, the vegetation in the lake starts to dwindle. Our feeding volunteer teams have resumed their daily feeding of the swans and will continue through April and then taper off in May. We continue to need additional volunteer help in various areas of caring for the swans, including daily feedings. If you would be interested, please contact me at jgdingus@charter.net
